This chronicle of great wanderings immortalizes Tarai farmlands, where dramas and unusual incidents are taken for granted. It is full of the same edge-ofthe-seat narration, witty and chilling anecdotes with a cool assay of "look into points", that have made Rahul's earlier books so popular.

"You have entered a wrong zone, you will get puzzled" Billy Arjan Singh warned Rahul Shukla, "You would end up realizing that you have started a wrong thing. Tigers can't live in sugarcane".


