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Preface to Third Edition

"A midwife must be able to give the necessary supervision, care and advice to women during pregnancy, labor and the postpartum periods, to conduct deliveries on her own responsibility and to care for the newborn infant. This care includes preventative measures, the detection of abnormal conditions in mother and child, the procurement of medical assistance and the execution of emergency measures in the absence of medical help. She has an important task in health counseling and education, not only for the patients, but also within the family and community. The work involves antenatal education and preparation for parenthood, and extends to certain areas of gynecology, family planning and child care. She may practice in hospitals, clinics, health units, domiciliary conditions, or in any other service."—WHO.

In order to inculcate all these skills in a midwife as defined by WHO, high quality of training is required for nursing students. Indian Nursing Council has recommended the practical skills required for preparing a skillful midwife. This third edition of *Practical Record Book of Midwifery (Casebook) for BSc Nursing* has been prepared according to the recent guidelines recommended by Indian Nursing Council. Also, the important suggestions have been incorporated in this edition. At several places the contents are completely revised giving a fresh look to the book. It includes evidence-based comprehensive postnatal and neonatal assessment sheets developed by Delphi technique in NINE, PGIMER, Chandigarh, a tertiary care hospital. This will help BSc Nursing students to meet the practical requirements of midwifery and help them keep abreast with the challenging demands of profession. This will further help in reducing maternal and neonatal mortality and morbidity.

It is hoped that this record book will benefit the midwifery students in gaining practical skill in caring antenatal, intranatal, postnatal and neonatal cases along with insertion of intrauterine devices. This will help them to be proficient in providing not only hospital-based care but also caring mother and neonate in their own homes after discharge, as there is provision to record five domiciliary cases of postnatal and neonatal follow-up. All these practical skills will, in turn, help the students in carrying out their roles as midwife. We take this opportunity to thank the faculties of obstetrics nursing, NINE, PGIMER, Chandigarh for their help and cooperation while preparing this book.
